Dear Dr. Suk and our AMA Board of Trustees,

On behalf of the undersigned delegations, specialty societies, sections, state medical societies, and dedicated members of the American Medical Association, we write to express significant concern regarding potential federal cuts to Medicaid.

Medicaid is a critical lifeline for approximately <u>80 million Americans</u>, including children, low-income families, pregnant individuals, people with disabilities, and seniors. The 2025 House budget resolution (<u>H.Con.Res.14</u>), adopted on February 25, 2025, calls for policies that reduce federal spending by at least \$880 billion within the Committee on Energy and Commerce jurisdiction, effectively forcing cuts to federal spending on Medicaid.

Significant cuts to Medicaid, including per capita caps, limitations on provider or managed care organization taxes and state-directed payments, work requirements, or reductions to the FMAP, would not only reduce access to care for patients, but also threaten the financial viability of practices serving Medicaid populations, especially in primary care. Given that many physicians already face difficult decisions regarding Medicaid participation, further constraints could exacerbate existing health care disparities and access challenges in both urban and rural communities.

We believe that the AMA's respected voice is crucial at this moment, to show legislators, patients, and physicians that Medicaid is essential health care that transcends partisan divides. The AMA has a unique opportunity to reinforce that access to care for our most vulnerable populations is a cornerstone of our health care system and a shared value across the medical profession.

We ask the AMA Board of Trustees to act on our existing policy to:

- 1. Publicly oppose any cuts to Medicaid through all available communication channels, including official statements, media engagement, and legislative advocacy.
- 2. Mobilize the AMA's advocacy team to work with Congress and federal agencies to prevent cuts to Medicaid programs and advocate for sustainable Medicaid funding.

- 3. Collaborate with state and specialty societies to highlight the potential impact of Medicaid cuts on patients, physician practices, and state budgets.
- 4. Reaffirm the AMA's commitment to Medicaid expansion and adequate reimbursement to ensure physicians can continue serving the most vulnerable populations.

We deeply appreciate your commitment to the medical profession and the patients we serve. We look forward to working with AMA leadership in this crucial moment.
